Match: Refers to a college or university's academic suitability for a student.

Fit: Extends beyond purely academic considerations to encompass the student's academic, financial, personal, and social needs.

Students should apply to a variety of institutions:

- Safety the student will almost definitely be admitted
- Match the student is likely to be admitted
- Reach the student may be admitted
